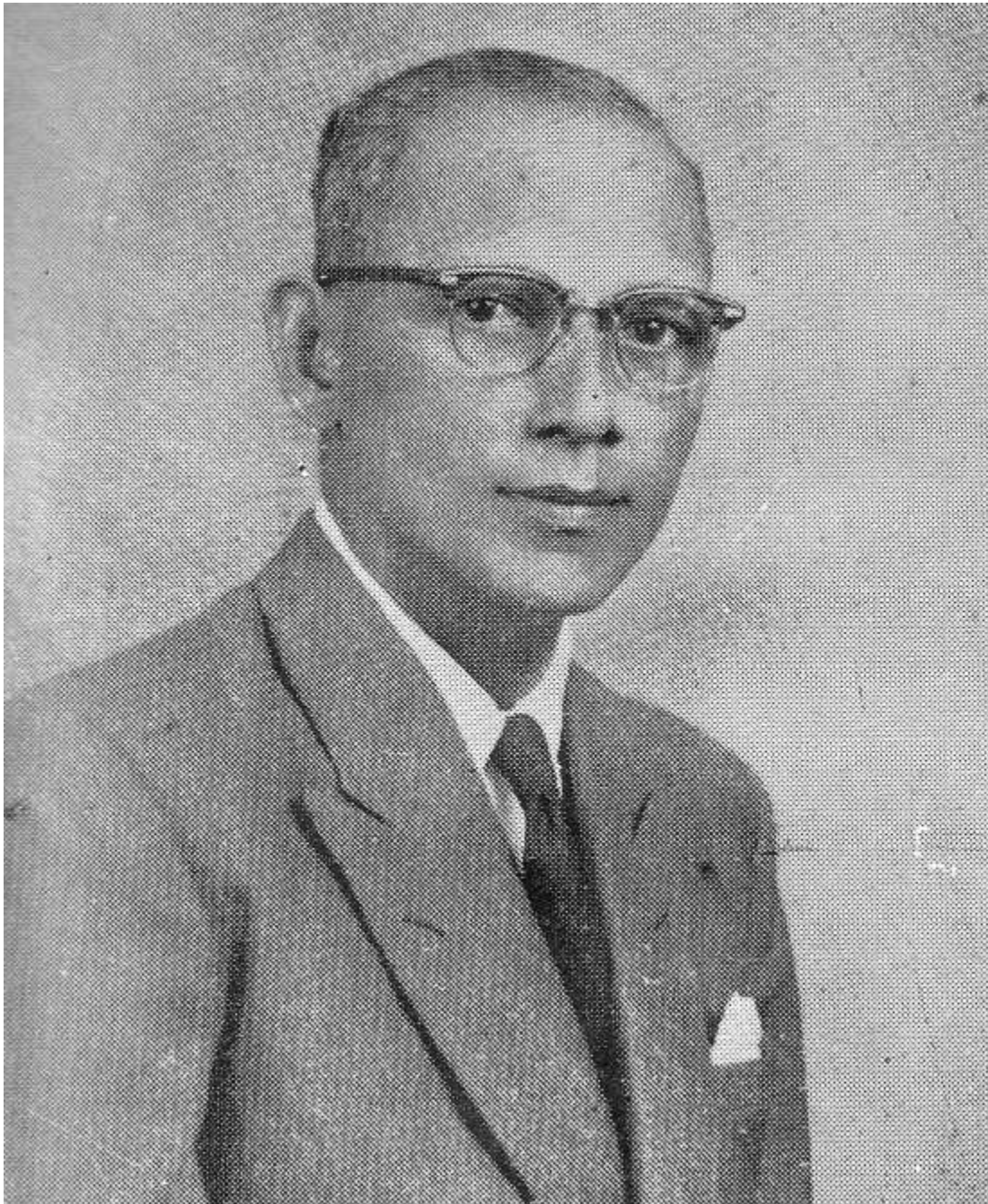

Report of the Committee of Management of the St. Stanislaus College Association for the period 1st January, 1958, to 31st December, 1958.

Membership

The total membership of the Association at the close of 1958 was 371, comprising 7 Life Members, 177 Ordinary Members, 63 Honorary Members, 20 County Members, 88 Associate Members and 16 Overseas members.

Activities

On Friday, 28th February, 1958 the Annual General Meeting was held at the College, Brickdam, and, at its conclusion there was the usual Members Social which drew an attendance of 79. This was the Association's first activity for the year. In March there was a Film Show entitled "Three Coins In A Fountain". Following this in April the Talks and Debates Sub-Committee presented "A Nation In The Making"-a forum on Federation, at which guest speakers Mr. S. S. Ramphal and Mr. Lloyd Searwar spoke on the constitutional and economic aspects of Federation. In May there was a Mixed Social and Caribart at which the attendance exceeded all expectations. During the course of the evening members and their wives were given a musical treat by the Troubadours' Steel Band and a sketch was performed by Students of the Fifth and Sixth Forms under the able direction of Mr. Claude Vieira. In June there was a Debate, the subject being "That this House believes that Women's Place is in the Home". Following this was the School-leavers' Social held in July at which boys leaving school are made aware of the Activities of the Association and encouraged to join. On Wednesday 20th August a Quiz was held at the College and money prizes were awarded to winning contestants. In September another Debate was held, the Subject being "That this House believes that the American intervention in the dispute between Communist China and Nationalist China is justified". October is the month reserved for the Bingo and this year was no exception. The Annual Dinner, held " at the Parochial Hall on 14th November, was attended by 129 members falling just short of the record set up in 1957. The last activity of the year, the Christmas Raffle, was a great success owing to the untiring efforts of Mr. S. A. Marques,

Jesuit Centenary Scholarship

At the end of his first year at the University College of the West Indies, a satisfactory report was received from the authorities on the work of the Centenary Scholar John Choy. During the year an appeal was made by the President to members of the Association asking them to donate a dollar a month for two years for this scholarship. The response to this appeal has been fair and to the end of 1958 the total amount of money collected, was \$3,706.01; \$1,618.12 was collected during the year. Expenses have so far totalled \$2,281.68 thus leaving a balance of \$1,424.23.

College Aid

At the end of 1958 the College Building Fund stood at \$6,966.71. The Bingo held in October- realised a profit of \$1,925.42 and the Christmas Raffle \$1,072.46 Donations received during the year for the Assembly Hall and Chapel totalled \$2,508.00.

Magazine

The Magazine made its appearance as usual at the Annual Dinner in November. This year the Magazine Committee was without the help of Mr. Jerome DeFreitas but the work was handled by Messrs. J. Fernandes Jnr. and J. Mahanger who together succeeded in obtaining a gratifyingly large number of advertisements. The quality of the Articles in the Magazine was high, evoking praise from the Governor at the Saint Stanislaus Prize-Giving held on 30th January, 1959.

General

At the first meeting of the new Committee of Management in March 1958 the President outlined to the members a new system of running the activities of the Association. He suggested that the activities be divided into the following Sub-Committees-Entertainment, Talks and Debates, Dinner, Bingo and Raffle-and the Chairman be appointed by the Committee of Management. These Chairmen will then appoint the members of their own Sub-Committees. This system met with the approval of the Committee and, on being put into operation, worked quite well.

Throughout the year there has been an all-round improvement in the attendance at activities of the Association but especially at the activities of the Talks and Debates Sub-Committee. Could this improvement be attributed to the fact that beer was served instead of soft drinks?

Although the Association finds itself in a sound financial position it is nevertheless still suffering from the non-payment of arrears of subscriptions. An appeal is hereby made to all those members who are in arrears asking them to pay in their subscriptions early.

Saint Stanislaus College has once again produced a Guiana Scholar. He is Frederick Campayne and like John Sparrock of the previous year, did Science Subjects.

At its last Meeting the Committee of Management placed on record an appreciation of Fr. Scannell's help co-operation and welcomed the new Principal, Fr. Hopkinson.
